MUSICIAN'S SPOTLIGHT THE BOAT DRUNKS' MIKE MILLER FACES SERIOUS HEALTH BATTLE

Trop Rock singer/songwriter and band leader Mike Miller is keeping his spirits high and his hopes abound to keep performing for fans. A few months ago, Mike learned he needed a bone marrow transplant, the only solution to his medical condition. Undeterred by this recent health crisis, Mike is busy performing, writing and recording a new CD.

In the winter of 2001, Mike Miller co-founded what is now one of the most sought after Trop Rock bands, The Boat Drunks. Their name originates from a play off Jimmy Buffett's song "Boat Drinks" and their most avid followers come from the Parrot Head community. Performing at Trop Rock festivals, Community festivals and Parrot Head events, The Boat Drunks have a busy schedule for the remainder of 2017 including multiple performances during the annual Parrot Head convention in Key West.

And Mike is looking forward to performing at all these upcoming gigs. He explains "As long as I am able, I'm going to be out there playing with the guys. I'd rather be doing that than anything else."

When Mike let his friends and fans know more about his condition, fundraisers were quickly organized all across the country. Mike has been a part of the Parrot Head world for **17 years and says "nothing they do** surprises me when it comes to their generosity and willingness to help **people." Mike himself has been** involved in raising funds for other musicians and Parrot Heads over the **years. "I've just never been on the** receiving end of it. Although it **doesn't surprise me, their generosity is overwhelming."**

In 2009, Mike was diagnosed with a rare blood disorder. He received lowdose chemo therapy to keep this health issue under control. In April this year, he learned his condition had become much more complicated and was diagnosed with MDS, a **disease where bone marrow doesn't** create enough healthy blood cells.

Mike shared with me his current prognosis "According to both of my doctors, a bone marrow transplant is the only opportunity for long-term survival. It's a pretty serious situation."

Thus far, Mike has been turned away from any possibility of a bone marrow transplant due to a lack of health insurance. After he retired from the police force, he was turned down for individual health insurance policies because of preexisting conditions. Subsequently, hospital stays and costly treatments have caused him to incur hefty medical debts. When he looked into a policy from the Affordable Care Act, adding a \$750 a month medical insurance premium plus a **\$9,000 deductible wasn't feasible** for his personal finances.

Mike's doctors are exploring every possible avenue to receive the much needed bone marrow transplant. His hematologist submitted Mike's medical case to two clinical trials at the National Institute of Health in Bethesda, MD in hopes of a medical study providing the transplant. He has not yet heard back from either one.

Another opportunity is coming up soon. Mike has a pre-paid medical evaluation at the Mayo Clinic where they will render their determination on his condition and (hopefully) look into possible financial assistance or payment plan options for treatment.

Right now, these are the only options on the table, but Mike declares "If there's any opportunity out there, I will pursue it."

In a little bit of reflection, Mike expressed that he's had a good life. He's cherished watching his daughter grow up and start a

family of her own and he's so very grateful to be doing what he loves – playing music. And he hopes he gets to do it for quite a while longer but adds "No matter how it works out, it's been a really good run."

For all of us who love Mike Miller's music and his wonderfully infections smile, there are many ways to chip in and help him fight this battle.

One of the questions Mike receives is about bone marrow donor matching. At this time, Mike has not been tested to determine the exact type of bone marrow donor he would need (this is a costly procedure that won't be done until he is approved for a transplant). According to DKMS, only 30% of patients are a bone marrow match to someone in their own family. So, Mike encourages anyone who would like to help, sign up on the international bone marrow donor list at DKMS.org. Mike points out that you may not be a match for him, but you could be saving someone's life and that's worth it.

Plus, there are numerous fundraisers and look for plenty more to occur in late October and early November before and during the annual Parrot Head Convention.

Fifteen enthusiastic members were there to make our little corner of the world a little bit cleaner.

It was a little cleaner than the first pick where we picked up 32 bags. For this pick up, 23 bags of trash were collected. The most unusual item found was 3 TV trays (BORING).

Our next scheduled MoDot Trash Pick Up is Sunday, August 13, 2017.

Since 1987, Missouri's Adopt-A-Highway program has involved volunteers across the state working together to clean up Missouri. Currently, more than 5,200 groups and 50,000 volunteers in the program **are focused on making Missouri's** roadsides cleaner and more attractive for our residents and visitors. More than 6,200 miles of roadway have been adopted.

Adopter groups include commercial and private enterprises, civic and non-profit organizations, families and individuals. MoDOT spends about \$6 million annually to remove litter from more than 385,000 acres of right of way along 34,000 state highway miles. Adopters perform about \$1 million a year in litter cleanup and beautification efforts. Every area kept free of litter by adopters allows MoDOT to devote resources to other much-needed tasks.

The 4th annual Crawfish and Shrimp Boil is in the books. We could not have picked a more perfect day. The weather was ideal with a low of 56 degrees and a high of 82!

Thursday, June 22nd was a busy day. At 10:30 in the morning, a group of volunteers pitched in to set up the big tent donated by Bank of Sullivan. That evening at 5:30, another group of volunteers met on Happy Island to help wash potatoes, clean corn and cut up andouille sausage in preparation for the Boil.

Friday morning, the shrimp and live crawfish were picked up at the St. Louis airport. After unloading the seafood on the island, it was back to Rohrer Park. Another group of volunteers showed up to help turn the tent 90 degrees, as it was decided to put the musicians in the pavilion instead of building a stage.

parrot heads were on hand to set up for the event. There was decorating to do, a bathroom to clean and stock, a public urinal to build, tables to set up and pots to get ready.

John Friday took the stage at 1:00 p.m. Because of his gentle soul, he is known as the "Teddy Bear of Trop Rock". Some of his musical TRMA achievements are 2013 Horizon Award and 6 nominations (2010-2013) including album and 2013 song of the year. In addition, he has numerous awards from other songwriter associations. "Worst Pirate in the World" was a total crowd pleaser. John kept us totally entertained until it was time to chow down.

Rod Krueger, Terry Kellett, Steve Carey and Mitch Jackson were our cooks for the day. They cooked up 80 pounds of crawfish, 100 pounds of shrimp, 50 pounds of andouille sausage,

70 pounds of potatoes and 200 half ears of corn. Their timing was perfect as all was ready to eat at precisely 4:00 p.m.

After eating, all in attendance were treated to a performance from Thom Shepherd and Coley McCabe, both award winning singers/songwriters. Redneck Yacht Club got everyone singing. Coley's emotional "I Am A Woman" had many in tears. For the crowd-pleasing song "Djibouti", John Friday returned to the stage to accompany them on harmonica.

Thom, and his Radio Margaritaville hit "Always Saturday Night," are featured in the documentary "Parrot Heads: The Movie," and he won the Radio Show of the Year Award at the 2015 Trop Rock Music Awards for "Live From The Redneck Yacht Club." Along with his own radio singles in Texas, Thom is the writer of five #1

singles for other artists – "Redneck Yacht Club" (Craig Morgan), "Riding with Private Malone" (David Ball), "The Night Is Young" (Kyle Park), "My Texas" (Josh Abbott and Pat Green), and "Beer Season" (Kevin Fowler). In total Thom has had over 10 singles and over 100 songs recorded by other artists. Coley McCabe has had several major

artist cuts including Loretta Lynn and SHeDAISY as well as writing most of the songs on her selftitled CD which boasts the presence of Kenny Chesney on "The Next Sound You Hear".
