Donny Brewer is a Parrot Head, sure, Rasta fan, yeah, but the Texas born and bred multi-instrumentalist is more than that. In fact he started in his teens playing big-hair rock in bars he wasn't even old enough to be in.

Later, in college, he found he could make more money playing country in Texas dance halls. Eventually he got fired from his job and gave up his art education to to tour with country acts. There he was

raw country to rock and blues to islandy tunes. And what about those islandy tunes? All the other material had been shopped around with various bands with little success but not the islandy stuff.

With a small nudge (otherwise known as a giant shove) from his wife (now of 21 years), he finally dusted off that notebook, wrote some newly inspired tracks, and compiled them into two albums. And in this new age, you don't need a record deal budget to share your music with the world. All you need is a computer, a couple guitars, and a good mic. Of course it helps to have 30 years experience as a musician, songwriter, and engineer!

The one thing he discovered through recording theses
Trop Rock albums was this:

"This is who I've been all along. Writing and recording island, trop rock, or whatever you wanna call it is natural for me. It's easy. With other music, I always feel like I could've written it better, or done a better production or sang it better. I'm never quite happy with it, ya know. With this music it's like gravy. I hardly ever do a second vocal take. And it's like there's no rules. If I wanna throw in a goofy percussion part or change styles I can do that. It's my

music. It makes me happy. It makes me feel good. And hopefully it'll do that for other folks too. That would just be the icing on the...or the...lime on the margarita, or something!"

Now with the kids off to college, it's time to sell that big house, get an RV and head out where the Trop Rock people are: where else?



LUAU ON THE RIVER BENEFIT FOR FRANKLIN COUNTY HUMANE SOCIETY

The Route 66 Parrot Head Club hosted a Luau on the River fundraiser to benefit the Franklin County Humane Society of Union, MO. Last year the club hosted several fundraisers for charities. Tim & Mona Davis hosted the event in St. Clair on their private property which runs along the Meramec River.

The goal for this fundraiser for FCHS was to raise \$7,000.

We raised well over \$8,000, with a \$3,000 grant from American Family Insurance. Tim has an American Family agency in Ballwin and was able to secure the funds.

The event was held on July 8 from 1pm-10pm. For a \$20 donation, guests enjoyed a swimming area, including a version of a lazy river tube float. Dana's Shaved Ice served over 120

snow cone treats. Pappy's BBQ in St. Louis donated dinner. In addition, a silent auction contributed to some of the funds raised. The Cast Iron Dog Band played in the afternoon. The Pop Rocks Funk Band finished up the evening. The grand finale was a spectacular fireworks show put on by Tim and his daughter Carli Davis.

ROUTE 66 PARROT HEADS PRESENT CHECK TO RUSSELL HOUSE



On August 10, 2017, 20 members of the Route 66 Parrot Head Club presented a check in the amount of \$1,100 to Randi Turntine, Development & Volunteer Coordinator for Russell House - PCFCS.

The monies were raised on June 24th at the Route 66 Parrot Head Club's Crawfish and Shrimp Boil.

In addition to the monies raised, over \$3,600 in goods were donated.

The Russell House is a non-profit organization that provides services to victims of family violence and their children. They support the principle that all individuals have a right to a life free of abuse and sexual assault. They seek to break the cycle of violence through increasing public awareness of the problem of domestic violence and sexual assault, acting as advocates for victims, coordinating existing resources for the benefit of survivors and providing safe environment for survivors. Phelps County Family Crisis Services, Inc. is the umbrella organization for Russell House. They strives to develop and maintain a confidential and supportive network that provides shelter, counseling and care for victims of domestic and sexual violence while educating the communities about prevention and the needs of victims and their families.


